Objectives:

- Be able to extract, parse, index, and classify source information for query processing
- Understand and evaluate fundamental IR models: Boolean, Vector Space, Probabilistic, and Fuzzy Set systems
- Know how to represent user's information needs, refine user's queries, and construct query results using snippets and categories
- Learn how to categorize, cluster, and filter query results using various supervised and unsupervised learning strategies

Policy:

Homework & project assignments. Homework assignments will be given approximately once a week and are due at the *beginning of the class lecture* on the due date. Late homework assignments will not be accepted; however, you are allowed to drop **one** of your lowest homework scores. Project assignments are also due at the beginning of class on the due date and cannot be dropped, but can be turned in late with penalty: 5% off on the 1st late day, 10% off on the 2nd late day, 15% off on the 3rd late day, and 20% off on the 4th late day.
